

**DRUG ENDANGERED CHILDREN TRAINING AND
ADVOCACY CENTER PROGRAM**

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Drug Endangered Children (DEC) Training and Advocacy Center Program coordinates the efforts of law enforcement, child protective services and the district attorney ensuring that children found in homes (or other environments), where drugs and/or alcohol are produced or being used, receive the appropriate care and attention.

The DEC Training Program brings first responders and social services providers together to train them on how to handle children found in drug environments. The DEC Training Program also provides staffing for a DEC Resource, Training and Technical Assistance Center for additional technical assistance.

Although the DEC Program has been funded with Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funding (authorized under the Omnibus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968, 42 U.S.C. § 3751[a]), beginning in FY 15/16, the DEC Program will be funded with Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) funding, 42 U.S.C. §10601 *et seq.*
