

**DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM**  
**Components: 40.20.102, 40.20.151, 40.20.161, 40.20.451**

**PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

Pursuant to California Penal Code §§13823.15-13823.16, the statewide Domestic Violence Assistance (DV) Program provides local assistance to existing domestic violence (DV) service providers throughout the State. This support is used to maintain and/or expand services to survivors of DV and their children, and is based on need as demonstrated by prior services statistics, local crime statistics, economic demographics, current and projected population figures, and geographic and cultural factors. The DV Program is designed to provide support for the development of DV services for unserved and underserved populations, including, but not limited to, rural areas, non-English speaking individuals, persons of color, and various geographical areas without services.

Projects funded are mandated to provide the 13 services outlined below:

- Twenty-four-hour crisis hotlines;
- Counseling;
- Business centers;
- Emergency “safe” homes or shelters for victims and families;
- Emergency food and/or clothing;
- Emergency response to calls from law enforcement;
- Hospital emergency room protocol and assistance;
- Emergency transportation to shelters/other safe locations;
- Supportive peer counseling;
- Counseling for the children of victims;
- Court and social service advocacy for victims;
- Legal assistance with temporary restraining orders and other protective and/or custody orders, devices, and custody disputes; and
- Community resource and referral for victims, and household establishment assistance.
