PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The purpose of the American Indian Child Abuse Treatment (NA) Program is to fund American Indian tribes, consortium of tribes, or American Indian non-profit community-based organizations to facilitate the provision of therapeutic clinical services or culturally-centered services to American Indian child victims and support services to the non-offending family members. Support services include: assistance in providing information on crime victim compensation services and assistance in understanding and in helping children prepare for participating in the criminal justice system.

The NA Program was authorized by Public Law 98-473, as amended, and is funded through the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program (42 USC §§10601; 10603).

For FFY 2014/15, Recipients continue to report high incidences of crimes being committed within their communities (homicides, suicides, substance abuse, and domestic violence).
