PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Probation Officer Training (PT) Program is administered by the Chief Probation Officers of California (CPOC). CPOC has been delivering training to probation officers for more than twenty years. In recent years, CPOC has created a Training Division and has increased the frequency of its training delivery in an effort to provide quality probation-specific training. CPOC has extensive experience with obtaining California Standards and Training for Corrections course certification, identifying and working with trainers, developing curricula, securing training locations, coordinating with probation departments and managing training delivery throughout the State.

For the PT Program, the CPOC receives Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Services*Training*Officers*Prosecutors (S*T*O*P) Formula Block Grant Program funds to develop and deliver training to probation officers throughout the State of California which focuses on enhancing probation officers' skills specifically in the area of supervision of domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence and stalking.

2014/15 PERFORMANCE STATISTICS

- Two eight-hour “*Think Trauma*” trainings were provided. The first was on August 19, 2015, in Sacramento, and the second was on August 20, 2015, in Santa Ana. A total of 73 probation staff attended.
- Both onsite trainings were well received with the first training in Sacramento receiving a 4.8 evaluation on a 5 point scale; and the second training in Santa Ana receiving a 4.9 evaluation on a 5 point scale.
- A four-hour, web-based training curriculum was developed based on lessons learned in the development and delivery of the two aforementioned onsite trainings.
