PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Comprehensive Shelter-Based Domestic Violence Services Program provides funding to domestic violence shelters to provide: direct services to victims or domestic violence; prevention activities in an attempt to alter the public's awareness, attitude and behaviors related to domestic violence; and increase access to services for unserved/underserved populations in their service area(s).

Direct Services include:

- Twenty-four hour crisis hotline;
- Counseling (individual and peer group);
- Business centers;
- Emergency safe homes or shelters for victims of domestic violence and their children;
- Emergency food and clothing;
- Emergency response to calls from law enforcement;
- Hospital emergency room protocol and assistance;
- Emergency transportation;
- Counseling for children;
- Court and social advocacy;
- Legal assistance with temporary restraining orders and custody disputes;
- Community resource and referral;
- Household Establishment Assistance; and
- Cultural/Linguistic Competency.
