PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Family Violence Prevention Program, pursuant to California Penal Code §13820-13823, is designed to provide family violence prevention education and to increase general awareness of family violence prevention programs. This vital program collects and disseminates model protocols for intervention systems, and provides training to agencies in dealing with family violence prevention. Additionally, through coordination oversight with community resources, they identify resources, and provide training opportunities and tools, as well as technical assistance to the DV field. The toolkit, "Making the Case for Domestic Violence Prevention through the Lens of Cost Benefit" is distributed throughout the state in tandem with a marketing strategy and prevention newsletter. Electronic needs assessments and evaluations provide input for future research and program development.
