## Cal OES Symbology Standards

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### Purpose

This document outlines Cal OES' GIS standard symbology practices to serve as a guide to local, tribal, state, and federal partners providing geospatial support to emergency management activities in California.

### Intended Audience

The intended audience for this document is California emergency management GIS stakeholders, including local, tribal, state and federal emergency management partners and other non-governmental supporting partners.

### Symbology Standards

Cal OES GIS leverages four primary emergency management and public safety symbology sets when selecting specific symbols for emergency management GIS activities. They are, in order of preference:
