- 3. Review minutes from the February 11, 2017 meeting**

Stephen D. Mayville:

- 4. Report from CalOES Staff – Brian Abeel**

- HMEP Grant
 - a. Subgrant application is open. It was announced on April 7 and application forms can be found on our website. The application is due to Cal OES by July 31, 2017.
 - b. Contact Erika Olsen to inquire about the application process. After applications are received, she will work with each LEPC Chair to prioritize and approve applications.

 - c. The Subgrant performance period will be 10/15/2017 to 9/15/2018.
- SERC Update
 - a. Last SERC Meeting was March 29, 2017. There was discussion and presentations. The items discussed were:
 - i. The SERC strategic plan assessment results prepared by Sac State – The acting SERC chair said Cal OES will be sharing the assessment with the SERC members for consideration and discussion at the next meeting with regard to moving forward with the SERC Strategic Plan.
 - ii. Meanwhile, HazMat has been directed to write a SERC Strategic Plan which will be shared for discussion at the next meeting.
 - iii. LEPC Regional Plan Project - Phase III has been put on hold because Cal OES is planning to follow other states in having local hazardous material emergency government plans meet the LEPC regional plan requirement since they have similar elements; and, because the EPCRA intent is for local hazardous materials emergency planning. Cal OES is drafting a paper that will state this. There was discussion at the SERC meeting about whether or not this is the right course to follow since the regional perspective could be lost. Further discussion on this topic at the next SERC meeting.
 - iv. LEPC Support – The LEPCs discussed with the SERC the difficulties of running an LEPC especially since they are volunteers with no funding source. The SERC chair affirmed that each LEPC has a designated liaison from Cal OES. Cal OES Hazmat is initiating monthly conference calls with the Liaisons and CSTI to establish a base of services. Further discussion on this topic at the next SERC meeting.
 - v. LEPC Website – Under construction. Since the last meeting, Cal OES HazMat has worked with the Cal OES Webmaster to get online the individual LEPC webpages. The LEPCs’ webpages are a subpage of the Cal OES Regions webpages. Each Cal OES Region LEPC webpage consists of information pertaining to the LEPCs within that Cal OES Region (Inland – LEPC III, IV, V; Coastal – LEPC II; Southern – LEPC I, VI). The LEPC webpages contain an Introduction, Regional Map, Contact Information, and then the LEPC documents. The “LEPC Documents” web part is still being developed and fine-tuned; will contain Membership listing, By-Laws, Handbook, Emergency Plan, Meeting Information (Agendas and Minutes). HazMat is still working with the Chairs and Liaisons to collect “LEPC Documents.” Once the LEPC webpages are finalized, the maintenance of the website will be a coordinated effort between the Cal OES Liaison, Cal OES Regional Web Manager, and the LEPC chairs. Also, there is now a shared drive within Cal OES where all LEPC documents are being stored electronically; this will be the repository location.

- HazMat Regional Team Concept
 - a. Type II HazMat vehicles are coming in and equipment is being inventoried.
 - b. Maintenance issues are being addressed as they become known; vehicles are being driven to California from the Midwest.
 - c. Chief Jan Dunbar is the lead on the project. He is currently on leave but will be returning on July 1.
 - d. In the meantime, Cal OES HazMat is working with HME (contractor) to get the vehicles ready for distribution to the regions.
 - e. In the near future, Cal OES will be sending a formal letter to describe the distribution of vehicles and the training associated with the vehicles.

 - a. The railroads and the state are involved in legal proceedings to determine the legality of the fee assessment for the transportation of hazardous materials by rail.

 - a. The Cal ARP proposed regulations adding a program 4 element, as result of the Refinery Task Force Recommendations, have been submitted to the Office of Administrative Law for approval.

 - The US EPA Exercise completes a huge widget for the LEPCs. First exercise in ten years.
 - Brian Abeel – Per Federal Title 42 section 1103 Chapter 116 EFRCA, the plan should include methods and schedules for exercising the emergency plan. No set time as to how often an exercise should occur. The plan itself should be reviewed annually and updated as needed.
- d. Training – Report by Trisha Pollett
 - CSTI Calendar has been published
 - San Diego Hosting CSTI Outreach Hazmat Specialist Series 1F and G May 23 – June 2 Contact Incident Commander directly for number of available spots. No grant funding available. San Diego Fire sending 12 Hazmat Techs.
 - CalOES Hazmat by Rail Type II Hazmat Program moving forward. Training will begin as soon as all contracts are in place, approximately May 26.
 - LEPC VI submitted their list of Continuing Challenge registration grants. There were 22 applications submitted, however there are only 15 grants available (and 7 alternates). No word on the allocations as of yet.

 - Captain Andrew Kibby - Moving forward with hazmat training center located at Ben T. Clark Training Center. Two railcars will be moved to their permanent location next week. In the future, we will be able to host the Hazmat Specialist Series. We currently host the Hazmat Tech Training.
