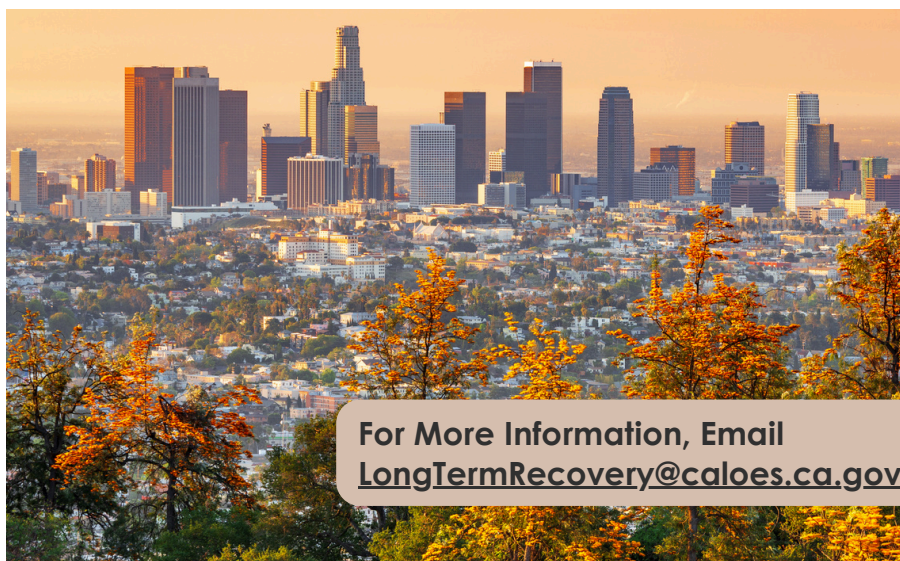

CalOSBA's Outsmart Disaster: New Program

The Outsmart Disaster Train-the-Trainer program expands disaster resilience capacity across California by equipping community partners, local leaders, and business support organizations to deliver the curriculum directly to small businesses.

The program builds a trained, statewide network of facilitators who provide consistent, practical guidance on preparedness, continuity planning, and recovery. By empowering trusted messengers already working with small businesses, it helps ensure resilience planning—including completion of the Outsmart Disaster Resiliency Roadmap—is accessible, culturally responsive, and realistic for businesses focused on day-to-day survival.

Partners are equipped to independently deliver workshops, provide one-on-one coaching, and support small businesses with preparedness actions and access to recovery resources. The program also strengthens collaboration between CalOSBA and local partners while creating scalable, aligned messaging around business resiliency.

SBA implemented a builder self-certification option allowing some disaster loan borrowers to bypass certain state and local permitting delays if approvals have not been received after 60 days. The policy is intended to speed up rebuilding and allow faster use of SBA disaster loan funds for recovery.
