



Terrorism Seminar: Transnational Repression



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Transnational repression (TNR) is the practice of foreign governments extending their authority beyond their borders to threaten, silence, and harass dissidents and members of diaspora communities. These activities violate the sovereignty of host countries, undermine democratic values, and infringe on individual human rights. This course is conducted by subject matter experts in the field of international human rights laws and investigations and with members of Joint Terrorism Task Force experts with a background in the relevant faiths, customs, and cultures. This 8-hour course is POST-certified and is intended for law enforcement only. Topics include:

- Introduction to the definition, scope, and breadth of TNR activity within the United States
- Detailed analysis of applicable State, Federal, and International laws, including the HUNT and TRAP Acts
- Detailed analysis of the top transnational repressive nations' targets of repression
- Detailed analysis of top transnational repressive nations' tactics, techniques, and protocols (TTPs)
- Analysis of common investigatory strategies.
- Articulate understanding of TNR through a homeland security lens with an analysis of threat actors currently operating in California.
- Case study discussion of top threat actors
- Skills to identify and successfully report transnational repression to appropriate state and federal authorities.
