- First Issue property has been submitted to FEMA for phase II Review
 - In the process prioritizing and creating batches for future submissions

Project Area

- Community meetings have been scheduled in each of the project areas
 - Whitmore: 2/2, 6:00–8:00 PM — Whitmore Community Center
 - Oak Run: 2/3, 6:00–8:00 PM — Oak Run VFD (Volunteer Fire Company)
 - Lakehead: 2/10, 6:00–8:00 PM — Lakehead Lions Club
- Developed a Fire Safety Workshop that will be covering Defensible Space, Home Hardening, the CWMP, and the local Defensible Space ordinance. There will also be a display table with home hardening materials for homeowners to view and discuss.
- Planned attendees: local CAL FIRE units, CWMP staff, contractors, and an IBHS representative
- Provide paper applications and a space for in-person help
- Outreach: USPS postcard mailers to all addresses in the three communities' ZIP codes, SCFSFC, RCD and local CAL FIRE Social media posts

North Coast Opportunities in Lake County

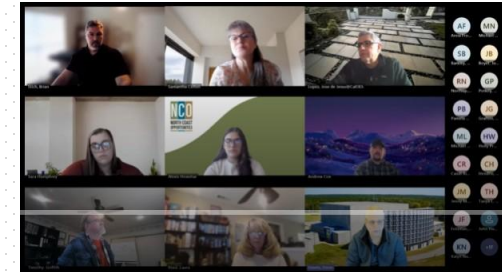

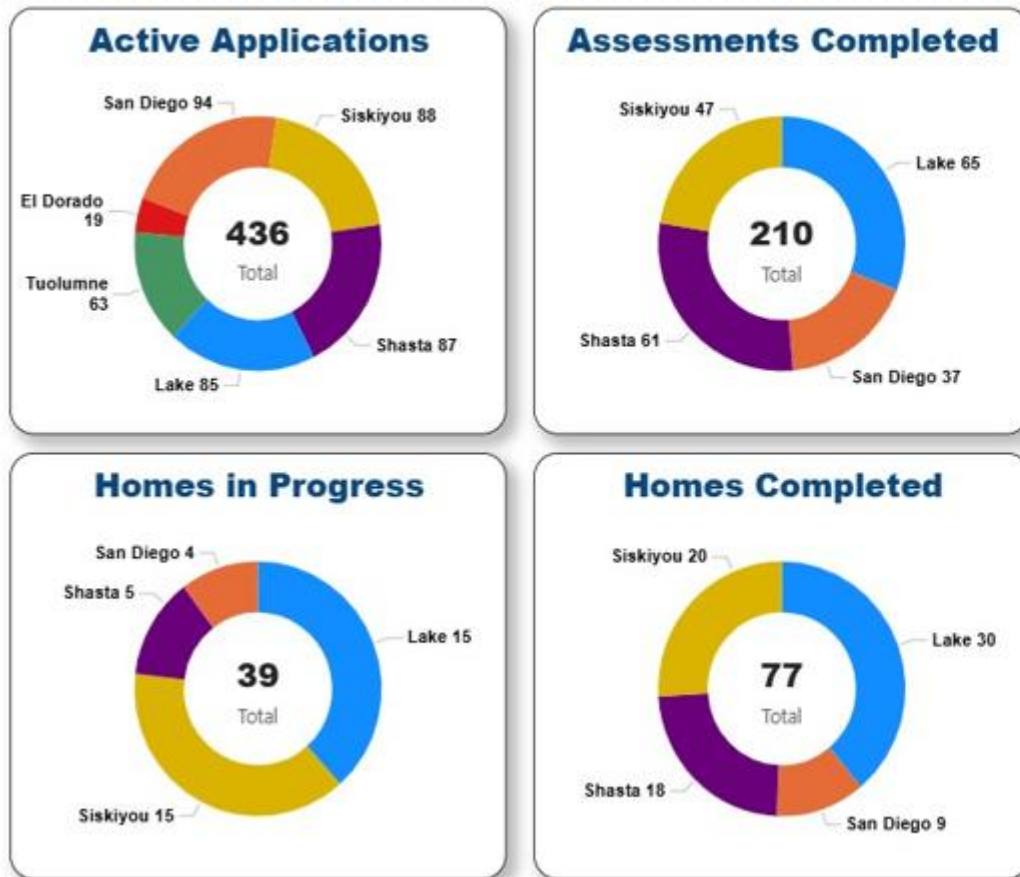


Senate Bill 254: The California Legislature passed and Governor Gavin Newsom signed SB254, which requires a comprehensive assessment to analyze and develop long-term reforms that protect access to insurance, reduce litigation costs, provide fair and expeditious compensation to claimants, support wildfire mitigation, safety, and community resilience, and ensure large electrical corporations are accountable for safety and also have the financial health to attract low-cost capital on behalf of ratepayers.

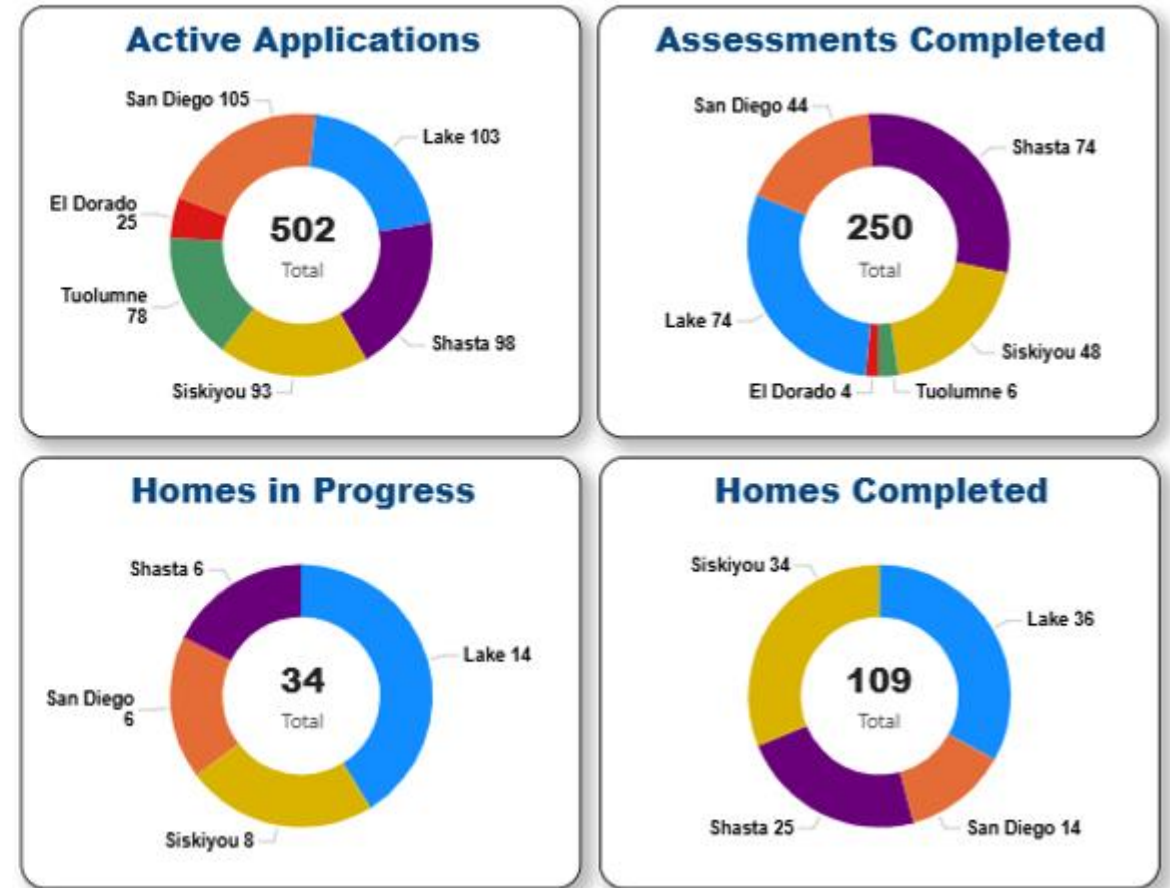
As directed by SB 254 (2025), the California Earthquake Authority (CEA), in its role as Administrator of the California Wildfire Fund, is responsible for preparing and delivering a report (Study) that includes findings and recommendations.

CWMP Pilot Program Next Steps

- **CWMP Funding Budget Act 2022** (AB-179) Funding \$13 Million
 - ~\$6 Million Committed to Siskiyou County for HMGP Grant ~\$24 million
 - ~\$7 Million Committed to Riverside County for HMGP Grant ~\$26 million
 - Both Projects submitted to FEMA on 11/21/2024 utilizing funding opportunity DR-4699-CA (California Severe Winter Storms, Straight-line Winds, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides) FEMA Review will take ~7-12 months.
 - Update: 13 million reverted per 2025-26 State budget
- **SB-946** Personal Income Tax Law: Corporation Tax Law: exclusions: wildfire mitigation payments.(2023-2024)
- **Proposition 4**
 - Grants under the Home Hardening Program to retrofit, harden, or create defensible space for homes at high risk of wildfire to protect California communities

CWMP Pilot Program Next Steps

- **SECTION 1. Section 91510 of the Public Resources Code is amended to read:**
 - 91510. (a) Of the funds made available by Section 91500, \$135,000,000 shall be available, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to the Office of Emergency Services for a wildfire mitigation grant program. The Office of Emergency Services shall coordinate with the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection in administering these moneys. The grant program shall assist local and state agencies to leverage additional funds, including matching grants from federal agencies. Funds may be used to provide loans, rebates, direct assistance, and matching funds for projects that prevent wildfires, increase resilience, maintain existing wildfire risk reduction projects, reduce the risk of wildfires to communities, or increase home or community hardening. Projects shall benefit disadvantaged communities, severely disadvantaged communities, or vulnerable populations.

CWMP Authority - Executive Director Report

Assembly Bill No. 38: Prescribed Disclosure Notice

- This bill, on or after January 1, 2021, would require the seller of any real property located in a high or very high fire hazard severity zone to provide a prescribed disclosure notice to the buyer, if the home was constructed before January 1, 2020, of information relating to fire hardening improvements on the property and a list of specified features that may make the home vulnerable to wildfire and flying embers and which features, if any, that exist on the home of which the seller is aware.
- **The bill, on or after July 1, 2025,** would require the disclosure notice to also include the State Fire Marshal's list of low-cost retrofits. The bill would also require a seller who has obtained a specified final inspection report to provide to the buyer a copy of that report or information on where a copy may be obtained.

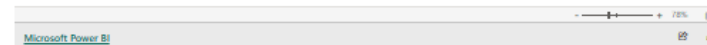
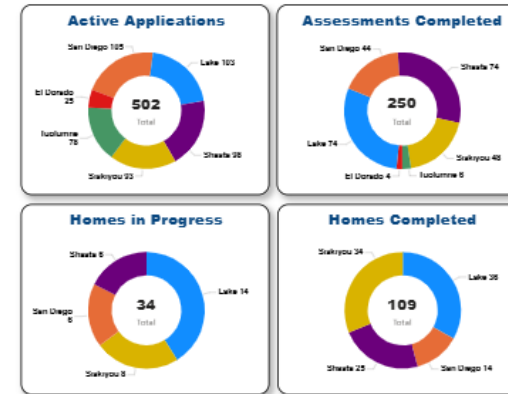
