
2025-2026 Legislation

- **SB 470**, Laird. Bagley-Keene Open Meeting Act: teleconferencing. There are no new requirements. The amendments provided by SB 470 extend the sunset dates in 3 sections related to the remote and teleconference rules that were implemented after COVID 19. The existing remote and teleconference meeting rules now extend through January 1, 2030, and do not expire this January 1, 2026.
- **SB 616**, as amended, Rubio. Community Hardening Commission: wildfire mitigation program.
 - Vetoed.
- AB 441, as amended, Hadwick. Wildfire prevention: Office of Wildfire Technology Research and Development: wildfire mitigation program.
 - pending in the California State Senate.
- **AB 1531** as introduced, Committee on Emergency Management. Office of Emergency Services: comprehensive wildfire mitigation program.
 - passed and signed into law. This bill would require, on or before July 1, 2026, the Department of Insurance to be added as an ex officio nonvoting member to the California Wildfire Mitigation Program Board created pursuant to the joint powers agreement..

CWMP Pilot Program Next Steps

- CWMP Funding Budget Act 2022 (AB-179) Funding \$13 Million
 - ~\$6 Million Committed to Siskiyou County for HMGP Grant ~\$24 million
 - ~\$7 Million Committed to Riverside County for HMGP Grant ~\$26 million
 - Both Projects submitted to FEMA on 11/21/2024 utilizing funding opportunity DR-4699-CA (California Severe Winter Storms, Straight-line Winds, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides) FEMA Review will take ~7-12 months.
 - Under CWMPA Review

SB-946, Personal Income Tax Law: Corporation Tax Law: exclusions: wildfire mitigation payments. (2023-2024)

Proposition 4

 Grants under the Home Hardening Program to retrofit, harden, or create defensible space for homes at high risk of wildfire in order to protect California communities



CWMP Pilot Program Next Steps

- SECTION 1. Section 91510 of the Public Resources Code is amended to read:
 - 91510. (a) Of the funds made available by Section 91500, \$135,000,000 shall be available, upon appropriation by the Legislature, to the Office of Emergency Services for a wildfire mitigation grant program. The Office of Emergency Services shall coordinate with the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection in administering these moneys. The grant program shall assist local and state agencies to leverage additional funds, including matching grants from federal agencies. Funds may be used to provide loans, rebates, direct assistance, and matching funds for projects that prevent wildfires, increase resilience, maintain existing wildfire risk reduction projects, reduce the risk of wildfires to communities, or increase home or community hardening. Projects shall benefit disadvantaged communities, severely disadvantaged communities, or vulnerable populations.

Assembly Bill No. 38: Prescribed Disclosure Notice

• This bill, on or after January 1, 2021, would require the seller of any real property located in a high or very high fire hazard severity zone to provide a prescribed disclosure notice to the buyer, if the home was constructed before January 1, 2020, of information relating to fire hardening improvements on the property and a list of specified features that may make the home vulnerable to wildfire and flying embers and which features, if any, that exist on

- The bill, on or after July 1, 2025, would require the disclosure notice to also include the State Fire Marshal's list of low-cost retrofits. The bill would also require a seller who has obtained a specified final inspection report to provide to the buyer a copy of that report or information on where a copy may be obtained.
- Bill Text AB-38 Fire safety: low-cost retrofits: regional capacity review: wildfire mitigation.









CWMP – Shasta County Highlights

Pam Bates: Shasta County Fire Safe Council

Roles and Responsibilities – SCFSC and Partners

- SCFSC: Project Management, Construction Management (SOWs, bids, contractor oversight, inspection), contracting, grant and finance management.
 - 3 SCFSC staff dedicated to the project (PM, CM, Project Assistant).
- WSRCD responsibilities: Outreach, education, application processing, assessments, SOWs and Site-specific checklist.
 - 3-4 RCD staff
- Our model a small core team, with tightknit relationships with local agencies and contractors. Very efficient, scalable, and can adapt when needed.



Successes:

- Homeowners extremely happy with results, appreciative of personal attention and education. Have helped them with WF Prepared Home certification, sale of homes.
- Strong team of contractors, have become very specialized, experts in implementing MQSs.
- 17 homes completed to date, 14 more will be completed or in contract by Nov 15 (for a total of 31)
- Time from Assessment to HH completed: 8 weeks
- Can work on multiple homes simultaneously
- Average total cost per home: \$45,300
 - Average cost for Defensible Space: \$4,700
 - Average cost for Home Hardening Construction: \$40,600
- Cost share cap has been effective in retaining program participants, homeowners know what to expect (e.g., reduced from \$6337 to \$3000).



Challenges

- Homeowners in our area are hesitant to participate in "government" programs.
- Homeowner confusion between our program and other CAL FIRE and FEMA projects in the area, bad experiences with PG&E.
- Remoteness of homes and limited access (slows implementation, increase costs)
- Number of parcels limited to No-Issue Parcels currently. This causes distrust of the process (not first in, first served; upset that there are "flags" on their property, no timeline as to when we can work on their home)
- Dispersed No-Issue Parcels reduces the development and effectiveness of Fire Resilient Communities.
- Implementation blocked due to FEMA review delays
