CDAA-2022-04: Alisal Fire - California Disaster Assistance Act Funding

CALIFORNIA GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES

On July 12, 2022, a Director's Concurrence was issued to secure funding to help Santa Barbara County respond to and recover from the Alisal Fire. This fact sheet contains information regarding the available assistance and California Disaster Assistance Act (CDAA) application information.

Important Disaster Information

The Alisal Fire (CDAA-2022-04) makes available CDAA funding for eligible costs in Santa Barbara County.

The incident period is October 11, 2021, through November 20, 2021.

Applicants Eligible for Assistance

The following local government entities are eligible for disaster assistance under CDAA:

- Cities
- Counties
- Special Districts
- School Districts
- Community College Districts



Available Assistance – Public Assistance Program

State cost share 75 percent and local share 25 percent of the eligible costs. The types of work eligible are illustrated below:

PERMANENT WORK

- Roads and Bridges
(Category C)
- Water Control Facilities
(Category D)
- Buildings and Equipment
(Category E)
- Utilities
(Category F)
- Parks, Recreational Facilities, Other Items
(Category G)

Note: Force Account Labor Permanent Work - Regular and overtime eligible.
