EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

INTRODUCTION

The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), Office of Grants Management, Victim Services (VS) Branch presents the annual fiscal and programmatic status report to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for fiscal year (FY) 2022-23. This report provides the Legislature, our stakeholders, and Subrecipients with a comprehensive understanding of the work being accomplished across California through our programs. This report lists each of the VS Branch's programs, Grant Subawards, fund sources, funded amounts, budget program/components, and the resulting statistics gathered for FY 2021-22 (July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023) for each VS Branch program.

In FY 2022-23, the VS Branch administered approximately \$374 million in funding, through programs that respond to victims' needs or promote an effective criminal justice system response to victims. The following pages provide a snapshot of the activities, allocations, and statistical data related to the 77 victim services grant programs administered by the VS Branch. The below table is a sampling of the total data collected:

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The Program Highlights that are included below showcase the outstanding efforts of state, local, and non-profit victim services and criminal justice organizations and programs that Cal OES's VS Branch funds. The funding allows for prevention, intervention, and enforcement components that work toward achieving a safer California. The need for these services is on-going – without continued state and federal grant funding, many of these exemplary projects would cease to exist.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN UNIT

Venice Family Clinic (VFC), a Subrecipient of the Domestic Violence American Rescue Plan Program, was founded in 1970 and has grown into a Federally Qualified Health Center with 10 clinical sites in and around the Westside of Los Angeles, CA. With a mission to provide quality primary health care to people in need, VFC offers an array of comprehensive services to almost 27,000 people

annually, including the Safe Families Domestic Violence Intervention and Prevention Program.

Though perhaps not a typical setting for a domestic violence intervention program, VFC understands, that as a community health center (Clinic) they have a unique opportunity to address the issue. The survivor's visits can appear simply as a primary care medical visit, but in reality, the certified Domestic Violence Specialist provides individual counseling in Spanish or English to help survivors understand the dynamics of violence, assess their needs, develop safety plans, and examine the impact of violence on children and other family members.

The emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic trapped survivors of violence in close confines with their abusers, leaving them at increased risk for sustained abuse. VFC made important adjustments to keep the program accessible during this unprecedented time. They moved largely to a telemedicine model, scheduling, and conducting all appointments by phone utilizing blocked numbers to communicate with patients to schedule safe times and locations to hold calls. For patients who had no privacy and no ability to receive personal calls, in-person visits to the Clinic were scheduled which could be explained as medical appointments. The Clinic staff reserved one day a week for these inperson meetings.

Case Study:

One patient, a middle-aged immigrant woman with adult children, had been chronically verbally, emotionally, and psychologically abused for decades, experiencing extensive coercive manipulation. She was referred to domestic violence counseling support by one of VFC's former volunteers, and after enrolling in the Clinic as a patient she was immediately connected to a Domestic Violence Specialist for domestic violence counseling. VFC designed her counseling with utmost thought for her safety. Her sessions took place when she was at work, and attention was paid to safely crafting an exit plan and ensuring the welfare of her pets. Through counseling, she has begun to reestablish her self-worth and acknowledge the abuse she experienced. Now stronger, she ultimately made the decision to leave her marriage and live on her own. She has subsequently been granted a divorce and continues to work with the Domestic Violence Specialist to build her self-worth, heal, learn how to set boundaries, and maintain her personal safety.

CHILDREN'S UNIT

Rady Children's Hospital-San Diego is a nonprofit, 511-bed pediatric-care facility dedicated to excellence in care, research, and teaching and is a Subrecipient of the Child Abuse Treatment (AT) Program. The AT Program provides funding for comprehensive psychotherapy services to children victimized by abuse and/or

neglect. Psychotherapy services for family members and/or caregivers of child victims are also available to help with the treatment of the child.

Case Study:

An 11-year-old child with a history of trauma exposure came to therapy after witnessing a shooting outside of her home. The child's mother tried to perform life support assistance to the teenage shooting victim while she observed. The victim later died. Following this incident, the child experienced post-traumatic symptoms, including nightmares, heightened anxiety, hypervigilance, dissociative symptoms, and fear of being separated from her mother. A therapist began working with the child who quickly engaged and was very open about communicating the trauma and her symptoms. Goals of treatment included decreasing the child's anxiety, processing the trauma she witnessed, and helping her develop coping skills to deal with triggers and trauma reminders. The therapist engaged the child in completing Trauma Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (TF-CBT) to work through the trauma and practice the skills learned in TF-CBT. Now that she is nearing the end of treatment, the child has reported a decrease in her overall level of anxiety since services started. She also reported that she has been able to sleep in her own room again, which she has not done since the shooting occurred. She has also expressed that she is able to tolerate trauma reminders better, such as when she hears loud noises. In addition, the child has learned several techniques to manage her anxiety, such as deep breathing, using sensory tools, and progressive muscle relaxation.

LAW ENFORCEMENT & COUNTY VICTIM SERVICES UNIT

The Sacramento Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force focused efforts to increase resources towards proactive investigative efforts to combat child sexual abuse. They started the year with an Undercover Concepts and Techniques class as a beginning for Operation Secret Admirer. This operation was a multi-agency undercover operation to combat online-facilitated sexual exploitation of children, which led to the arrest of 18 suspects. The second operation was the two-week joint 2023 Cybertip Operation, which focused on investigating Cybertips from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The Sacramento ICAC received 13,817 Cybertips in 2023. During this operation, 29 agencies participated in 37 search warrants related to Cybertips-23 suspects were arrested. The final operation was Operation Monster Mash, a two-week operation that focused on suspects that were downloading Child Sexual Abuse Material (CSAM) to their personal devices and computers. Many of the targets were found in possession of horrendous CSAM files that depicted sexual images of infants and toddlers that were forced to engage in sexual abuse, including some that involved bondage, discipline, dominance and

submission, and sadomasochism. The operation resulted in 12 arrests and one pending arrest warrant.

During the year, they continued their efforts in promoting a Northern California regional training center for forensic, internet crimes, and wellness training to service their 115 affiliated agencies.

Case Study:

During April 2023, a registered sex offender began communicating with an undercover (UC) Sacramento ICAC Task Force detective who posed as a 13year-old child. The perpetrator had previous convictions in 2014 for sending pornography to a minor and in 2016 for communicating with a minor to commit a sex offense and attempted lewd and lascivious acts with a child under 14. The perpetrator offered to meet with the UC detective and offered take her to get a tattoo "somewhere sexy" on her body. The perpetrator offered to teach the UC detective about sex and described in graphic detail sexual experiences with older people when he was her age. The perpetrator informed her he enjoyed role playing and pretending his sexual partners are minors; encouraged her to view pornography; provided graphic search terms to seek pornography; encouraged her to conceal their communication from her mother and to sneak out to meet with him and come to his residence; and sent explicit pictures and videos of himself to the UC detective. The perpetrator suddenly stopped communicating with the UC detective and did not return correspondence. ICAC detectives coordinated with a local sex offender registration unit and determined the perpetrator had moved out of his residence, purchased a different vehicle, changed his telephone number, and was preparing to move out of state. On June 7, 2023, ICAC detectives intercepted the perpetrator just prior to him leaving California. The perpetrator was arrested for three separate violations and was sentenced eight years in prison.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE UNIT

The California Partnership to End Domestic Violence (Partnership), contracted with RALLY, an advocacy company, to create and disburse a campaign to further public awareness about the availability of gun violence restraining orders through the Gun Violence Restraining Order Outreach (GO) Program. The Partnership was able to conduct this outreach via various communication methods, such as billboards, social media, and in-person events. By utilizing domestic violence shelters as Second Tier Subawards, they were able to ensure outreach efforts were conducted statewide to reach domestic violence victims and marginalized communities.

Additionally, a previously funded Subrecipient of the Domestic Violence Assistance (DV) Program ceased business operations creating fund availability for new Subrecipients to join the DV Program. Through a competitive Request for Proposal (RFP) process, three new Subrecipients that focus on providing

culturally specific domestic violence services to marginalized communities were able to be funded, for an overall total of 104 funded Subrecipients.

Lastly, the program formerly known as the Equality in Prevention and Services for Domestic Abuse (GL) Program, was renamed the Equality in Domestic Violence Prevention and Services (EX) Program. This Program also released a competitive RFP and is funding three Subrecipients that provide direct domestic violence services to the LGBTQIA+ community.

HOUSING UNIT

Lake Family Resource Center is a local non-profit organization serving all of Lake County, providing services in child and youth development, parenting education and personal development, family and community violence prevention, intervention, treatment, and health & wellness. Lake Family Resource Center is a Subrecipient of the Domestic Violence Housing First (XD) Program. The XD Program provides victims/survivors of domestic violence with safe, permanent housing, and ongoing trauma-informed supportive services tailored to address the individual needs of each victim/survivor that allows them to choose how to best rebuild their lives.

Case Study:

A victim of domestic violence and her three children were referred to Lake Family Resource Center because she was fleeing from her abuser, who is also the father of her children. She was physically, emotionally, and financially abused and did not want to continue in the relationship. She also had a long history of previous abuse and childhood trauma which she still struggles with.

The client was employed and was working on getting her medical assistant certification. Once she earned her certification, it increased her pay allowing her to bring more money into her household. She had been staying in Lake Family Resource Center's emergency shelter and through the XD Program, she was connected to a landlord and was able to secure a large enough home to meet the needs of her family. A Family Advocate helped her create a budget and set a goal of saving one thousand dollars or more, which was achieved in a few months. She received therapy services to support her in her healing. Other supportive services from the XD Program included biweekly case management, transportation assistance, and financial assistance. The client was able to purchase a car through a local dealership, however, a few months later the vehicle began having issues. The Family Advocate helped her create a stabilization plan, which included rental assistance for six months and assistance with the car repair costs. The client continued with her financial goals and savings and maintained her employment. The XD Program assisted with the car repair costs and she can now drive herself to work and provide reliable transportation for her children.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING & LEGAL ASSISTANCE UNIT

Justice At Last is a mobile legal practice, with satellite offices throughout the San Francisco Bay Area, exclusively serving human trafficking survivors. They provide comprehensive support in the following legal areas: criminal records clearance, immigration relief, employment rights, restraining orders, emergency custody, youth law, debt relief, and identity theft, and are a Subrecipient of the Human Trafficking Victim Assistance Program.

Case Study:

Justice At Last supported a male foreign-national labor trafficking survivor with crime victim's rights representation and immigration relief. The client was prosecuted at the federal level for crimes he was forced to commit by his traffickers and Justice at Last represented him as his victims' rights attorney. They collaborated with his defense attorney to obtain a reduced sentence through extensive advocacy to show that he was a victim of trafficking. However, on the day he was meant to be released from federal custody, he was detained by immigration officials and deportation proceedings were started. Despite limited means of communication with the client and facing an accelerated deportation timeline, Justice At Last ensured that their client would be safe from immediate deportation. They worked with several community partners to file a petition in the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeal to stay his deportation order. Justice At Last also worked with a congressmember to address the difficulties in accessing the client while he was detained. As a result of this collaboration, the client is temporarily safe from being returned to his home country, where he would be at great risk of persecution and re-trafficking.

SEXUAL ASSAULT UNIT

To continue to address the significant impact of COVID-19 on sexual assault service programs 103 Subrecipients funded through the Rape Crisis (RC) Program, Campus Sexual Assault (CT) Program, and the Victim Advocacy in Detention Facilities (KA) Program were able to utilize augmented funds through the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act (FVPSA) American Rescue Plan (ARP) COVID -19 Rape Crisis Centers and Sexual Assault Programs (FVSA) Supplemental Funding Program. The purpose of these funds is to assist with the transition to virtual/remote services for rape crisis centers, sexual assault programs, tribal programs, and culturally specific programs that provided crisis services, support services, and assistance to survivors of sexual assault and support the increased emergency needs of sexual assault survivors as a result of the COVID-19 public health emergency.

UNDERSERVED VICTIMS UNIT

The Underserved Victims Unit continues to fund victim assistance service programs to various underserved populations throughout California.

For fiscal year 2023-24, the Underserved Victims Unit distributed approximately \$28 million via eight programs to assist unserved/underserved victim populations throughout California. The three largest funded programs are the Unserved/Underserved Advocacy and Outreach (UV) Program, The Innovative Response to Marginalized Victims (KI) Program, and the Elder Abuse (XE) Program. The Underserved Victims Unit also supports tribal programs: Tribal Court Advocates (KT) Program, Native American Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault (DS) Program, and Native American Child Abuse Treatment (NA) Program.

The UV Program provides access to culturally appropriate victim services for unserved/underserved victims of crime. This Program receives a total of \$14,767,950 to serve unserved/underserved victims.

The KI Program supports innovative projects to provide services to marginalized victims of crime and victims of poly-victimization. The Program focuses on providing direct services to young males of color, victims of gang violence, refugees, low wage workers (janitorial, service industry, etc.), transgender, and foster care youth. This Program just completed a competitive process that distributed a total of \$4,931,960 to 23 Subrecipients.

The XE Program focuses on enhancing the safety of elder and dependent adult victims of abuse, as well as, bridging the gap between elder justice service providers and victim service providers. The Program supports the elderly and dependent adult communities by improving their ability to access services, identifying their needs, and improving the delivery of services to these populations. The Program just completed a competitive process that distributed \$2,555,930 to 12 Subrecipients.

VICTIM WITNESS & PROSECUTION UNIT

Cal OES provides Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program funds to 37 Child Advocacy Centers (CACs) in California through the Child Advocacy Center (KC) Program. The purpose of the KC Program is for CACs to provide direct victim services to child abuse victims/survivors and their families through a multidisciplinary team approach. These services include victim/survivor- centered, trauma-informed forensic interviews, advocacy, direct or referral to therapy/counseling, and referrals for medical exams.

The KC Program makes an indelible difference in the lives of abused children across California. The KC Program expands trauma-informed child abuse services and interventions statewide. CACs are unique organizations statutorily

mandated to coordinate government agencies investigating child abuse cases; including police, prosecution, and child welfare professionals such as doctors and therapists trained to treat child abuse victims/survivors. VOCA funds awarded to CACs have increased and improved response to child abuse allegations to ensure that children receive prompt and improved victim/survivor centered services. This Program ensures a greater number of abused children in California receive access to immediate coordinated intervention and healing services.

One of the most beneficial aspects of the KC Program is that it allows CACs to utilize funding to meet the specific needs of their unique community. All funds are spent with the goal of reducing trauma to abused children. Some of the significant improvements include, but are not limited to:

- Creation of CACs in underserved communities to ensure that children in these areas in California receive the support they need when they are most vulnerable.
- Hiring dedicated, specially trained, forensic interviewers who conduct trauma-informed, developmentally appropriate interviews with child abuse victims/survivors.
- Increasing the number of CACs able to provide counseling and advocacy services to victims/survivors of child abuse and decreasing the wait time for therapy services.
- Increasing language access services by employing bi-lingual staff to provide children and families services.

The KC Program has improved service provisions and enabled communities in California to better respond to the needs of child abuse victims/survivors.

VICTIM SERVICES MAJOR FUND SOURCE DESCRIPTIONS

Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program (Formula Grant Program)

The VOCA Formula Grant Program is authorized by the Victims of Crime Act of 1984 (34 U.S.C. § 20103 (a) and (b)).

VOCA authorizes federal financial assistance to states through the VOCA Formula Grant Program for the purpose of supporting eligible crime victim assistance programs that: 1) respond to the emotional and physical needs of victims of crime; 2) help primary and secondary victims of crime to stabilize their lives after a victimization; 3) help victims of crime understand and participate in the criminal justice system; and 4) provide victims of crime with a measure of safety and security. Crime victim is defined as any person who has suffered physical, sexual, financial, or emotional harm as a result of the commission of a crime.

2. Services*Training*Officers* Prosecutors (STOP) Violence Against Women (VAW) Formula Grant Program

The STOP VAW Formula Grant Program was authorized in 1994 through the Violence Against Women Act(VAWA). VAWA, Public Law 103-322 was reauthorized in 2000, 2005 and most recently in 2013. The STOP Formula Grant Program is administered by the Office on Violence Against Women, Office of Justice Programs, U.S. Department of Justice.

The STOP Formula Grant Program promotes the development and the implementation of effective, victim-centered law enforcement, prosecution, and court strategies to address violent crimes against women and the development and enhancement of victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women. States and communities are encouraged to restructure and strengthen the criminal justice system response to domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking, drawing upon the experience of all participants in the system.

3. The Family Violence Prevention and Services/Domestic Violence Shelter and Supportive Services (FVPS) Grant

The FVPS Grant is authorized by 42 U.S.C. § 10401, Family Violence Prevention and Services Act.

The Family Violence Prevention and Services/Domestic Violence Shelter and Supportive Services grant, administered through the Administration on Children, Youth and Families (ACYF) Family and Youth Services Bureau (FYSB), is designed to assist states in their efforts to support the establishment, maintenance, and expansion of programs and projects to: 1) prevent incidents of family violence, domestic violence, and dating violence; 2) provide immediate shelter, supportive services, and access to community-based programs for victims of family violence, domestic violence, or dating violence, and their dependents; and 3) provide specialized services for children exposed to family violence, domestic violence, or dating violence including victims who are members of underserved populations (45 CFR § 1370.10(a)).

4. Children's Justice Act (CJA) Grants to States Program

The CJA Grants to State Program is authorized by Section 107(a) of the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (P.L. 111-320).

The purpose of the CJA Grant is to assist States in developing, establishing and operating programs designed to improve: (1) the assessment and investigation of suspected child abuse and neglect cases, including cases of suspected child sexual abuse and exploitation, in a manner that limits additional trauma to the child and the child's family; (2) the assessment and investigation of cases of suspected child abuse-related fatalities and suspected child neglect-related fatalities; (3) the investigation and prosecution of cases of child abuse and neglect, including child sexual abuse and exploitation; and (4) the assessment and investigation of cases involving children with disabilities or serious health-related problems who are suspected victims of child abuse or neglect.

5. Sexual Assault Services Formula Program (SASP)-specific to the RC Program

The Sexual Assault Services Formula Program (SASP) is authorized by 34 U.S.C. § 12511. SASP was created by the Violence Against Women and Department of Justice Reauthorization Act of 2005, as amended by the technical amendments to that act, and is the first federal funding stream solely dedicated to the provision of direct intervention and related assistance for victims of sexual assault.

The SASP Formula Program directs grant dollars to states and territories to assist them in supporting rape crisis centers and other nonprofit, nongovernmental organizations or tribal programs that provide core services, direct intervention, and related assistance to victims of sexual assault. Rape crisis centers and other nonprofit and tribal organizations, such as dual programs providing both sexual violence and domestic violence intervention services, play a vital role in assisting sexual assault victims through the healing process, as well as assisting victims through the medical, criminal justice, and social support systems. Funds provided through the SASP Formula Program are designed to supplement other funding sources directed at addressing sexual assault at the state and territorial level.

6. State General Fund (SGF)

The California State Budget Act authorizes funding, in statute, each fiscal year to specific programs. These programs support services for victims including, but not limited to, housing for homeless youth, legal resources and information, family violence prevention, and training and technical assistance.

7. State Penalty Fund (SPF)

The State Penalty Fund was created as a depository for assessments on specified fines, penalties, and forfeitures imposed and collected by the courts for criminal offenses and used to support victim services programs, amongst others. These State funds can be used for match requirements following the provisions of the *Subrecipient Handbook*, Section 9.060.

BEST PRACTICE INITIAL CHILD INTERVIEW TRAINING PROGRAM | 2024

The purpose of the Best Practice Initial Child Interview Training (VQ) Program is to educate first responders on how to properly conduct a forensically-sound, trauma-informed victim interview during an initial child sexual abuse investigation to ensure successful prosecution.

This is accomplished through the creation of three training videos: a Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training certified video for law enforcement; a video specific to Child Protective Service personnel; and one for the broader category of first responder mandated reporters. These training videos are to be made available statewide.

The VQ Program is supported through Children's Justice Act (CJA) Grant Funds.

The purpose of the Child Advocacy Center (KC) Program is for Child Advocacy Centers (CACs) to provide direct victim services to child abuse victims/survivors and their families through a multidisciplinary team approach. These services must include victim-centered, trauma-informed forensic interviews, advocacy, direct or referral to therapy/counseling, and referrals for medical exams.

California Penal Code §11166.4 states "each county may use a children's advocacy center to implement a coordinated multidisciplinary response, pursuant to Section 18961.7 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, to investigate reports involving child physical or sexual abuse, exploitation, or maltreatment. A county that utilizes a CAC to coordinate its multidisciplinary team shall require the CAC to meet standards pursuant to California Penal Code §11166.4, part b."

Required components of the KC Program include, but are not limited to: a multidisciplinary team consisting of law enforcement, child protection, prosecution, mental health, medical, and victim advocacy professionals who work together to help children heal from abuse; a dedicated child-focused setting designed to provide a safe, comfortable, neutral place where forensic interviews and other CAC services may be provided for children and families; direct forensic interviewer and advocacy services; and case review and tracking.

The NC/SC Program addresses the requirements of Welfare and Institutions code §18275 by funding training centers, one in Northern California (Northern Child Sexual Abuse and Technical Assistance Center) and one in Southern California (Southern Child Sexual Abuse and Technical Assistance Center). The training centers are responsible for developing training programs for interagency teams of service providers throughout California, including law enforcement, social services, health care providers, and mental health providers. Service providers who receive the training will then provide training in their communities.

- Providing training on sexual abuse issues
- Providing up to four Child Forensic Interview Training classes
- Providing training topics that cover the issues and needs of child sexual abuse victims with disabilities
- Ensuring training is culturally and linguistically competent
- Providing course certification to meet licensing and/or continuing education needs of the attending professionals
- Using training assessments that evaluate the trainers and the effectiveness of the training curriculum

The purpose of the Court Appointed Special Advocates (KS) Program is to fund Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) programs in California to provide more children in foster care with a CASA volunteer.

CASAs are trained community volunteers appointed by juvenile court judges to advocate for children who are placed into the protective custody of the child welfare system due to abuse or neglect. CASAs review court facts and documents pertaining to the child's case and submit formal reports to the judge at every scheduled hearing/review. The CASA monitors the child's case to assure that the judicial and child welfare systems are moving ahead to secure a safe, permanent home for the child, and that court-ordered services are provided to the child.

Required components of the KS Program include: recruiting volunteers, training CASA volunteers pursuant to the Welfare & Institutions Code § 102(d) and 103(a), and providing oversight, support, and supervision to CASA volunteers.

The purpose of the Domestic Violence Housing First (XD) Program is to provide victims/survivors of domestic violence with safe, permanent housing, and ongoing trauma-informed supportive services tailored to address the individual needs of each victim/survivor that allows them to choose how to best rebuild their lives.

The XD Program is modeled after the Housing First Model, as defined in Welfare and Institutions (W&I) Code § 8255, to address the prevalence of homelessness in California. The Housing First Model is an approach to connect individuals and families experiencing homelessness quickly and successfully to permanent housing without preconditions and barriers to entry, such as sobriety, treatment, or service participation requirements.

Required components of the XD Program include, but are not limited to: housing assistance, financial assistance, and supportive services for victims. Organizations that receive XD Program funding must also hire a minimum of one full-time equivalent advocate, who has met the requirements of a Domestic Violence Counselor as described in Evidence Code §1037.1(a)(1) as well as a minimum of one half-time equivalent advocate who serves as a Housing Coordinator.

The XD Program is supported with funds through federal Victims of Crime Act Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program (VOCA).

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE MOBILE HEALTH CARE SERVICES PROGRAM | 2024

The purpose of the Domestic Violence Mobile Health Care Services (FO) Program is to provide domestic violence victims/survivors and their children access to COVID-19 testing, vaccines, and primary health care through weekly mobile health care visits.

To ensure comprehensive and essential healthcare for domestic violence victims/survivors and their children in all areas of California, Cal OES initially adopted a regional approach where Subrecipients coordinated services for all domestic violence shelters and programs within identified regions. The outcome of this approach resulted in 48 of the 58 counties statewide to remain unserved. Cal OES then re-released the Program to serve the remaining 48 counties. This combination of strategies more efficiently covered all areas of California. Services provided by the FO Program include, but are not limited to: COVID-19 vaccines; COVID-19 testing; primary health care (e.g. wellness checks, health exams, referrals); and post-acute COVID-19 care (e.g. education, rehabilitation, prevention, treatment, and support services for symptoms occurring after recovery from acute COVID-19 infection).

The FO Program is funded through the federal Family Violence Prevention and Services Act (FVPSA) American Rescue Plan COVID-19 Testing, Vaccines, and Mobile Health Unit Supplemental Funding Program (FVCO).

The purpose of the Human Trafficking Victim Assistance (HV) Program is to help human trafficking victims/survivors (sex trafficking and labor trafficking) recover from the trauma they experienced and assist them with reintegrating into society through comprehensive safety and supportive services using a traumainformed, culturally sensitive, victim/survivor-centered approach.

Required components of the HV Program include, but are not limited to:

- Twenty-four hour crisis hotline available for immediate crisis intervention and assistance:
- Emergency shelter;
- Temporary housing/housing assistance;
- Emergency food and clothing;
- Transportation;
- Emergency financial assistance;
- Psychological support/individual counseling;
- Referrals to local community services; and
- Legal assistance.

Organizations that receive funding through the HV Program must ensure staff working with human trafficking victims qualify as Human Trafficking Caseworkers as described in Evidence Code §1038.2 and are trained according to the minimum requirements therein.

Since fiscal year 2019-20, many HV Program Subrecipients shifted focus to better identify and serve victims of labor trafficking as well as sex trafficking. Examples have included additional training for victim service advocates and partner organizations (such as hospital/health clinic staff), co-locating human trafficking caseworkers in hospitals, clinics, and family justice centers, and the development of local multi-disciplinary teams with expertise in addressing the needs of labor trafficking victims.

The purpose of the Victim Advocacy in Detention Facilities (KA) Program is to increase access to appropriate services for victims of sexual assault in local detention facilities. Local detention facilities include adult detention facilities, juvenile detention facilities, and immigration detention facilities.

This is accomplished by funding a Sexual Assault Counselor, per Evidence Code § 1035.2, to focus solely on serving victims in detention facilities and acting as the point of contact to assist in eliminating physical or programmatic barriers. Required components of the KA Program include: collaborating with detention facilities; assisting with California Victim Compensation Board Claims; providing direct services; and participating in the Sexual Assault Response Team meetings.

The KA Program is supported with the following funds: State General Funds (SGF) – Victims of Crime Act Supplemental (VCGF), federal Victims of Crime Act Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program (VOCA), and federal Family Violence Prevention Services and American Rescue Plan (FVSA).

The purpose of the Victim Information and Notification Everyday (VN) Program is to track the location of inmates while incarcerated and inform victims of changes to incarceration location and/or release.

The VN Program, also known as VINE, supports the National Victim Notification Network services providing access to timely and reliable information about criminal cases and the custody status of offenders, 24-hours per day. This is accomplished by providing crime victims with VINE tracking service access, recording direct services, providing services regardless of immigration status, and providing free notification services. Victims and other concerned citizens can register by phone, email, text message, or TTY device to be notified whenever an offender's custody status changes. The system communicates with jail and prison booking systems in near real-time by transmitting updated information to the Appriss Data Network, which manages the automated interfaces and monitors offender status. VINE utilizes a free downloadable app via cellphone, laptop, or computer. When a change in the custody status of an offender occurs, county jails and state prison facilities transmit information through Appriss, which then immediately notifies registered crime victims of the offender's new status.

The VN Program is supported with the following funds: State General Funds (SGF) – Victims of Crime Act Supplemental (VCGF), State General Funds (SGF) – Victim Information and Notification Everyday (VINE), and federal Victims of Crime Act Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program (VOCA).

The purpose of the Victims Legal Resource Center (VR) Program is to provide victims, their families, and victim service providers with information about victims' legal rights in the criminal and civil justice systems and to provide tailored resource referrals.

The VR Program was established through the passage of Assembly Bill 1176 and codified as California Penal Codes § 13897-13897.3. The intent of the legislation was to ensure that crime victims receive information regarding legal issues. Required components of the VR Program include, but are not limited to:

- Providing callers with information about victims' legal rights to compensation;
- Providing service providers with information regarding the legal rights of victims of crime:
- Advising callers about potential civil causes of action and references to local legal aid and lawyer referral services;
- Advising and assisting callers in understanding and implementing their rights to participate in sentencing and parole eligibility hearings as provided by statute: and
- Referring callers to local programs, which include victim witness programs, rape crisis centers, domestic violence centers, and child sexual abuse centers.

The VR Program is supported with the following funds: State General Funds (SGF) – Victims Legal Resource Center (VLRC) and federal Victims of Crime Act Victim Assistance Formula Grant Program (VOCA).

The purpose of the Violence Against Women Vertical Prosecution (VV) Program is to improve the criminal justice system's processing of violent crimes against women through a coordinated, multi-disciplinary, prosecutorial response including specialized units with a highly qualified prosecutor and victim advocate.

The required components of the VV Program include vertical prosecution, when a prosecutor and a victim advocate are assigned to a case from the initial filing of charges through the penalty phase, victim advocacy, assignment of only highly qualified staff to the vertical prosecution unit, and community coordination where staff must attend regularly scheduled multi-disciplinary meetings in the project service area that pertains to the crime type(s) selected for vertical prosecution. Vertical prosecution has shown to improve conviction rates, reduce victim trauma, and provide more consistent and appropriate sentencing.

The VV Program is supported with funds through the federal Services*Training* Officers*Prosecutors Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program (STOP).

Hotline counselors assist callers via the phone line, text, or online chat. They counsel callers and connect them to appropriate service providers, providing a warm hand-off and terminating participation in the call once a connection has been made. The hotline can also be used as a message center for parents, guardians, and/or youth who wish to communicate with each other but do not want to speak directly.
