## President's Proposed Budget

Eliminates or reduces State and local grant funding by \$667 million for programs administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) ... such as the Homeland Security Grant Program



## President's Proposed Budget

The Budget also proposed establishing a 25 percent non-Federal cost match for FEMA preparedness grant awards that currently require no cost match



#### Federal Budget

- HSGP final funding level remains uncertain
- Continuing Resolution was extended for 2 weeks, until December 22, 2017
- No match requirement is plausible
- No cut to funding is plausible



#### **FY 2018 NOFO**

- California must be prepared for a February NOFO release with an April federal application deadline
- Subrecipients must begin considering FY 2018 projects with a <u>potential</u> for reduced funding and a match requirement



#### Considerations

- Subrecipients are NOT required to include match projects in the Advance Application
  - If required, match projects will be submitted at the time of final application submission
- California subrecipients are to begin developing projects based on:
  - FY 2017 Allocations
  - FY 2018 Cal OES Investment Justifications

#### Considerations

- Align M&A Projects to:
  - Investment Justification: #6 (PVE)
  - Core Capability: Planning
- Potential for 5% of funding to be allocated towards Cyber Security
  - A portion could be met at the State level



Proj. #	Project Title	Project Description
001	Swift Water Rescue Team Support	Support for multi-agency swift water rescue response training and equipment to maintain safe response. Teams are adding new members requiring basic swift water rescue technical training and current members require recurring perishable skills training. Teams are also in need of equipment to maintain response capability.
002	Emergency Operations Center Training	Provide training in Emergency Operations Center functions and response operations/protocols in order to ensure that all staff is capable and confident in their respective roles while in the Emergency Operations Center.
003	Purchase Radios Scalable	Purchase portable radios and radio accessories to replace outdated radios and supplement existing radio stock.
004	Multi Discipline Rescue Response Vehicle	A multi-disciplinary rescue vehicle equipped to transport the marine unit equipment, such as the Zodiac boat and dive unit equipment throughout the county. Additionally, the vehicle will be equipped with communication gear to be used in conjunction with the United States Coast Guard, National Park Service, and other regional Marine Units, and local Fire and Law agencies. This will be a regional asset.

005	Community Shield Exercise	Build on last year's exercise to test the coordination of SWAT, TCAT, Fire, Hazmat, Public Health resources and Emergency Management in response to a terrorist event.
006	Large Animal Disaster Training	This project supports additional training of large animal response for Disaster Animal Response Team






- **FFATA Financial Disclosure**: Removed from v1.18, but will be included as a separate attachment with the Final Application
- Match (NEW): Subrecipients are NOT required to include match projects in the Advance Application







#### • Project Ledger:

- <u>State Goals</u>: FY18 HSGP projects will need to align to State Goals. Additional information will be provided at a later time.
- <u>FY18 Investment Justifications (IJs)</u>: Updated FY18 IJs.
- <u>Subgrant Performance Period</u>: Pre-populated from the Grant Subaward Facesheet. This will apply to all POETE tabs.







- **Expenditure Period**: This section has been removed from the POETE tabs but will be captured on the Authorized Agent page.
- Expenditure Period Requirements:
  - Based on Cal OES "subrecipient" expenditures
  - 2 CFR 200.34 Definition
    - *Expenditures* means charges made by a non-Federal entity to a project or program for which a Federal award was received.





#### HSGP Administrative Update

- Only <u>UASIs</u> will report their EOP updates in the Unified Reporting Tool
