Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 HSGP Application Updates, Guidance, and Allocations

On February 27, 2023, the Federal Emergency Management Agency released the FY2023 HSGP NOFO with a number of programmatic changes. This memo provides HSGP subaward allocations and guidance to help facilitate the information necessary to submit a successful and complete federal application for FY 2023.

FY 2023 HSGP NPAs and required minimum spend are as follows:

- Enhancing information and intelligence sharing and cooperation with federal agencies, including DHS - 3\% minimum spend.
- Enhancing the protection of soft targets/crowded places $-3 \%$ minimum spend.
- Enhancing cybersecurity - no minimum spend requirement.
- Enhancing community preparedness and resilience $-3 \%$ minimum spend.
- Combating domestic violent extremism - 3\% minimum spend.
- NEW: Enhancing election security - 3\% minimum spend.

Subrecipients are to allocate a total of $\mathbf{3 0 \%}$ of SHSP and UASI award funds across the six National Priority Areas (NPAs). Five of the priorities have minimum spend requirements totaling $\mathbf{1 5 \%}$ of SHSP and UASI awards. Subrecipients will have the flexibility to allocate the remaining $15 \%$ across any of the six NPA's. The FY 2023 NOFO provides additional guidance related to the types of projects eligible under each NPA.

Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Activities (LETPA) minimum requirement is now 35\% of the award, an increase from 30\% in FY 2022. Additional guidance will be forthcoming soon from the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency in the form of an Information Bulletin as stated in the NOFO.

Management and administration costs for FY 2023 should still be captured under Investment Justification \#7.

The FY 2023 FMFW will be released in the following months, to be submitted with the final FY 2023 HSGP subaward application package.

The deadline to submit revised FY 2023 projects with final allocations to Cal OES is Monday, April 24, 2023. We provide as much time as possible for project changes as we need time for our complex internal review and submission process. This is to ensure projects are eligible, appropriately linked to investment justifications, specifically NPAs, and aligned to proper core capabilities. We appreciate your patience and cooperation during this coordinated effort.
