Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 HSGP Application Updates, Guidance, and Allocations

On April 16, 2024, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) released the FY 2024 HSGP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) with several programmatic changes. This memo provides HSGP subaward allocations and guidance to help facilitate the information necessary to submit a successful and complete federal application for FY 2024.

FY 2024 HSGP National Priority Areas (NPAs) and required minimum spend are as follows:

- Enhancing information and intelligence sharing and cooperation with federal agencies, including DHS – **no minimum spend requirement.**
- Enhancing the protection of soft targets/crowded places – **no minimum spend requirement.**
- Enhancing cybersecurity – **no minimum spend requirement.**
- Enhancing community preparedness and resilience – **no minimum spend requirement.**
- Combating domestic violent extremism – **no minimum spend requirement.**
- Enhancing election security – **3% minimum spend.**

Subrecipients are to allocate a minimum of 30% of State Homeland Security Program and Urban Areas Security Initiative award funds across the six NPAs. Election security is the only national priority, with a minimum spend totaling 3%. Subrecipients will have the flexibility to allocate the remaining 27% across the remaining priorities.

The minimum requirement for Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Activities (LETPA) will remain at 35% of the award. For an activity to be classified as LETPA, it must have both a law enforcement and terrorism prevention nexus. The LETPA project description must include an explanation of how the expenditure has both the law enforcement and terrorism prevention nexus. [Information Bulletin \(IB\)485](#) includes the

most up-to-date information on project selection considerations and allowable activities for LETPA investments.

Management and administration costs for FY 2024 should continue to be captured under Investment Justification #7. All emergency communications projects must comply with the SAFECOM Guidance and must be captured under Investment Justification #6. The project description should contain the SCIP goal and "emergency communications" in the project description.

The deadline to submit revised FY 2024 projects with final allocations to Cal OES is **Monday, May 20, 2024**. We provide as much time as possible for project changes as we need time for our complex internal review and to prepare for FEMA's transition to a new grants management system, FEMA GO, which will affect our application submission process for FY 2024. This timeline also helps ensure projects are eligible, appropriately linked to Investment Justifications, specifically NPAs, and aligned to proper core capabilities. We appreciate your patience and cooperation during this coordinated effort.
