Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 HSGP Application Updates, Guidance, and Allocations

On July 28, 2025, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) released the first of two versions of the FY 2025 Homeland Security Grant Program (HSGP) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) with several significant changes, including the removal of the Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) as a programmatic component.

On August 1, 2025, a third version of the FY 2025 HSGP NOFO was released with an updated State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSP) allocation, and the inclusion of UASI funding. This memo provides HSGP subaward target allocations, information regarding changes, and next steps.

California was allocated \$55,863,486 in SHSP funding, an overall increase of \$4,531,426 from FY 2024 HSGP. California was also allocated \$109,325,268 in UASI funding, an overall decrease of \$9,209,284 from FY 2024 HSGP.

The National Priority Areas (NPAs) and required minimum spends were also updated. There are now five NPAs for FY 2025, as opposed to six in FY 2024. Two new NPAs were added, and three were removed. The five NPAs, along with the relevant minimum spend percentages, are outlined below. SHSP and UASI subrecipients must allocate at least 30% of funding across the five NPAs.

The minimum spend requirement for Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Activities (LETPA) will remain at 35% of the award. For an activity to be classified as LETPA, it must have both a law enforcement and terrorism prevention nexus. [Information Bulletin \(IB\) 485](#) includes the most up-to-date information on project selection considerations and allowable activities for LETPA investments.

In the past, subrecipients receiving SHSP funds have continued to help meet the NPA minimum spend requirements to ensure our state meets its overall requirement as a condition of California's award. This will continue in FY 2025.

Cal OES is preparing a basic initial application that will be submitted no later than August 15, 2025. Currently, Cal OES does not have a date for when final project level details will be required from subrecipients. The below allocations are being shared so that subrecipients can begin planning.

Cal OES understands the importance of Homeland Security Grant funds in supporting state and local efforts to prevent terrorism and other catastrophic events. Cal OES recognizes subrecipients have many questions and concerns regarding the FY 2025 HSGP NOFO. Cal OES has updated its Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) page to address common questions received about the new terms and conditions contained in the NOFO. Cal OES is working diligently to not only submit the FY 2025 HSGP application, but also to obtain clarification regarding the new terms and conditions, and the new NPA requirements as listed in the most current FY 2025 HSGP NOFO.
