Subject: Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 HSGP Application Updates and Allocations

On August 8, 2025 and August 26, 2025, Cal OES released [GMM 2025-06](#) and [GMM 2025-08](#), which outlined subrecipient allocations and program updates. On September 27, 2025, DHS/FEMA issued the FY 2025 HSGP award notice that was later rescinded and reissued on November 21, 2025, significantly reducing the State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) and the Urban Security Area Initiative (UASI) grant awards to California and shortening the period of performance (POP) from three years to one year.

California joined 11 other states and the District of Columbia in filing a federal lawsuit in the Rhode Island District Court, *State of Illinois, et al. v. Kristi Noem, et al*, Case No. 1:25-cv-00495, challenging the reduction of SHSP and UASI funding to plaintiffs, as well as the reduction of the POP.

On December 22, 2025, the court issued an order: 1) restoring award funding amounts to those stated in the August 1, 2025, HSGP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO); and 2) restoring the periods of performance to those stated in the August 1, 2025, HSGP NOFO. On January 30, 2026, DHS/FEMA reissued the HSGP Award, which restored the three-year period of performance and funding levels to those set forth in the August 1, 2025, NOFO in accordance with the court's order and judgment.

Cal OES accepted the HSGP award on February 13, 2026. In doing so, Cal OES submitted a letter which set forth its understanding of the HSGP Award

This memo provides final FY 2025 HSGP subaward allocations and guidance for submitting required project-level details for DHS/FEMA review as part of the FY 2025 HSGP application process.

There are no changes to the Investment Justifications or minimum spend requirements, or allocation provided in [GMM 2025-08](#). The allocations are provided in this memo for reference.

The FY 2025 HSGP National Priority Areas (NPAs) and required minimum spends are as follows:

NPA	Minimum Spend Requirement
*NEW – Supporting Border Crisis Response and Enforcement	10% minimum spend
*NEW – Supporting Homeland Security Task Forces and Fusion Centers	No minimum spend
Enhancing the Protection of Soft Targets/Crowded Places	No minimum spend (no change)
Enhancing Cybersecurity	No minimum spend (no change)
Enhancing Election Security	3% minimum spend (no change)
Removed – Enhancing Information and Intelligence Sharing	-
Removed – Enhancing Community Preparedness and Resilience	-
Removed – Combating Domestic Violence Extremism	-

*Subrecipients must allocate a minimum of 30% of funding across the five NPAs.

The deadline to submit revised FY 2025 projects with final revised allocations to your HSGP Grants Analyst is April 14, 2026. This timeline allows subrecipients 15 days and provides Cal OES with adequate time to complete our internal review and to enter the projects into FEMA's grants management system, FEMA GO. To meet the grant requirements for an award under HSGP, the State must pass at least 80% of funding to local or tribal governments. By submitting our required project-level details in accordance with this, we can avoid unnecessary delays in receiving HSGP funding.
