Item 4-1: Statewide 9-8-8 CHS and CRM Status

- NGA 911 was awarded the contract based on a competitive process on December 30, 2022
- Kickoff meeting was conducted on January 11, 2023

- Initial site surveys completed at 8 locations
- An additional 4 locations will be completed this week
- Final location will be completed in March
- The initial survey included:
 - Introduction of selected vendor
 - Facility walkthrough
 - Initial discussions to identify workflow needs
- Additional detailed surveys and discussions will follow

INVOLVE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH AS SOON AS POSSIBLE

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH REMOTE ENGAGEMENT DURING TRANSIT IF POSSIBLE

ASSESS NEED FOR MEDICAL RESPONSE

ROUTINE

911 PSAPs refer to 988 regional call centers

- Distressed caller appropriate for phone intervention with trained behavioral health professional with referrals for services within 72 hours
- No homicidal thoughts, intent, or behavior
- Suicidal thoughts acceptable, if no plan and/or means

LEVEL 2 MODERATE

- Distressed caller with imminent need of inperson behavioral health support
- No homicidal thoughts, intent, or behavior
- Suicidal thoughts with no plan or no direct access to lethal weapons
- Minor self-injurious behavior

LEVEL 3 URGENT

- Active aggression
- Florid psychosis
- Homicidal thoughts with no active behaviors or intent
- Active cutting (selfinjurious behavior) with concern for medical risk Suicidal thoughts with plan and access to lethal weapons
- Magistrate-issued emergency custody order, if available and requested by law enforcement


LEVEL 4 EMERGENT

911 PSAPs dispatch law enforcement, EMS, and/or fire without delay

- Direct, immediate threats to life
- Active suicide attempt
- Active assault on others with ability to cause significant harm
- Any gun present and accessible
- Magistrate-issued emergency custody order issued with immediate security threat

Item 4-3: SETNA 9-8-8 Surcharge

- The 9-8-8 surcharge is set at \$0.08 for 2023 and 2024
- Fee calculation for 2025 and beyond
 - Budget requests are sent to Department of Finance for eligible expenditures for the 9-8-8 surcharge
 - The CA State Legislature approves the budget, which sets the revenue that must be generated from the 9-8-8 surcharge
 - Access line service providers send number of access lines to Cal OES
 - 9-8-8 surcharge is based on the budget and number of access lines
 - Letter is sent to CDTFA by October of each year

- 9-8-8 System Director for Cal OES has been appointed, permanent position is included in FY 2023-24 Budget Request
- Basic 9-8-8 to 9-1-1 transfers have been validated. Additional work is ongoing to implement full solution by July 2024
- 9-8-8 Technical Advisory Board has been established
- Budget Change Proposals for CHHS, DHCS, and Cal OES have been submitted to DOF for the SETNA 9-8-8 surcharge
