COMT Position Definition:

<u>Communications Technician (COMT)</u>: An ICS position that supports the technical aspects of the Communications Unit, including equipment and radio spectrum.

COMT Position Duties:

COMT - Communications Unit Technician

- Supports the technical functions of the Communications Unit
- Identifies requirements, installs, tests, troubleshoots communications systems
- Resolves interference issues
- Programs radios
- Maintains/repairs equipment
- Assists the COML
