













Ignition Resistant Construction Categories Cost to Date



 - o 47 in Whitmore, 37 in Lakehead, 60 in Oak Run
 - 15 Issue homes are currently being reviewed by SMEs. Goal is to have reports ready for FEMA review by Oct 1, 2025

Staffing and Contractors:

- Current Assessors on staff (or with WSRCD): total of 7
- 24 contractors on the pre-qualified list:
 - 5 General Contractors
 - 19 Defensible Space Contractors
- Hired part-time project assistant to assist with logistics, documents, contracts, SME coordination, etc.
- Signed a contract with outside DSpace project coordinator to assist with overseeing and inspecting DSpace work and to assist with SOWs.

Assessments and Site Work Progress:

- Total of 15 DSpace projects have been completed to date, and of those, home hardening has been completed on 4.
- 9 more DSpace projects planned to be contracted in the next 30 days
- Contractors have been selected for Home Hardening on 6 homes. Work on these homes will begin at the end of August.
- 3 No-Issue SOWs in progress
- 5 assessments scheduled for this month, including their first in Lakehead.

- CWMP, SPU and CAL FIRE teams visited the Project area to view the first homes hardened and various completed D-space projects
- CWMP, SPU and CAL FIRE teams attended SCFSC Board meeting May 22, 2025
- Current focus is on D-space until Biological Assessment is complete

- Biological Assessment has been received

- SMEs have provided initial reports to the county.
- FEMA is expected to take 3-6 months to complete their review and issue the initial Record of Environmental Consideration
- Phase I extension has been accepted
 - o Current Period of Performance is set to expire 2/22/2026.
- Plan to submit Notice of Exemption for CEQA
 - Will be handled by their CEQA Compliance Officer

Staffing and Contractors:

- Have secured an office space for the Project Manager near Project Area
- One full time Analyst has been hired
 - o Looking to hire one more
- Project Manager has been hired, started July 1, 2025.

- CAL FIRE attended a Home and Garden show on April 12th to provide material about Home Hardening, Defensible Space and the CWMP Project

EHP Phase I:

- Phase I Deliverables have been submitted
 - Currently 74 No Issue Properties
- Project Boundary has been finalized and expanded.
 - o Includes 7 additional parcels
- SME is same firm as Tuolumne County, should streamline collaboration with FEMA.
- Architectural history and biology results are complete.
- The Phase I work with FEMA for the previous projects (Shasta, Lake, and San Diego) streamlines the FEMA approval process.
 - The new process and lessons learned have assisted to expedite the completion of Phase I

Staffing and Contractors:

- Project Lead started July 17, 2024
- RFQ for construction manager has been posted
 - o Bid has ended with Seven submissions.
 - o Evaluations have been submitted as of March 10, 2025
- Hired two defensible space inspectors who will work as home assessors.

- Beginning to review sample outreach documents to build additional informational
 - o Flyers, brochures and PowerPoint presentations that will be integrated into the Public Outreach Plan.
 - o Flyers have been created and have been sent.
- Working with both County of El Dorado and the City of Placerville on the MQS's and determining what will require permits and how we can expedite the permitting process for the project.
 - Adding local ordinance information to the document for both County and City defensible space measures.
- Attended a stakeholder meeting on June 26, 2025, to identify long term, landscape wide wildfire resilience across the entire Weber Creek project area. CWMP, SPU and CAL FIRE were in attendance.

 - o Community Level Program Impact: 400 to 500 homes

Riverside County

 - o 25% State Match \$6.6 Million (Administration 5%)

Proposition 4

- \$1.5 billion to be available for wildfire prevention, including reducing community wildfire risk and restoring the health and resilience of forests and landscapes. Of these funds, the bill requires:
- \$135 million be available for a wildfire mitigation grant program: Grants under the Home Hardening Program to retrofit, harden, or create defensible space for homes at high risk of wildfire in order to protect California communities.

SB-946, Personal Income Tax Law: Corporation Tax Law: exclusions: wildfire mitigation payments (2023-2024). **Applies to California Wildfire Mitigation Program applicants.**
