#### Overview

The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), Interagency Recovery Coordination is comprised of six Recovery Support Functions (RSF) teams. The teams are Community Planning & Capacity Building (CPCB), Natural & Cultural Resources (NCR), Health & Social Services (HSS), Economic (ECON), Housing (HSG), and Infrastructure Systems (INF). The role of the RSF teams is to help communities with long-term recovery after disasters strike. This includes help to find additional funding opportunities that fall outside of Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and State Public/Individual Assistance

Over the past several years several Fire Departments suffered tremendous impacts that resulted in losses of equipment and staffing. These impacts have caused a significant dearth in the department's ability to carry out it's essential duties to serve the citizens of the City/County. The purpose of this guide is to highlight potential funding and technical resources to support the departments recovery efforts.

Program Description	The Homeland Security National Training Program (HSNTP)/Continuing Training Grants (CTG) provides funding via cooperative agreements to partners to develop and deliver training to prepare communities to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recovery from acts of terrorism and natural, man-made, and technological hazards.

Program Description	Conduct regional priority planning. Administer project development activities. Build capacity and sustainability among regional partners. Lead outreach and engagement. or Participate in Task Force efforts to coordinate regions



Eligibility	The Department will provide block grants to regional entities (Regional Block Grantees) and to eligible coordinating organizations (Statewide Block Grantees) to support the statewide implementation of the program.
Maximum Award	The grants funded with these Guidelines utilize the \$110 million of General Fund monies appropriated to the Department for the RFFC Program. This funding is available for encumbrance or expenditure until June 30, 2026, with full liquidation until June 30, 2028. Up to 5.17 percent of the appropriation may be used by the Department for administrative costs. Should additional funding consistent with the purposes of the RFFC Program become available in future years, the Department may, at its discretion, make new grants or allocate funding to increase grants funded under these Guidelines.

USDA Rural Development – Community Facilities Direct Loan & Grant	
Application Period	Ongoing
Program Description	Funds can be used to purchase, construct, and/or improve essential community facilities, to purchase equipment, and to pay related project expenses



Eligibility	Public agencies, community-based nonprofit corporations, and federally recognized tribes. Priority is given to small communities with a population of 5,500 or less, and to low-income communities with a median household income below 80% of the state non-metropolitan median household income. Other requirements apply authority to borrow money and manage projects, inability to finance the project from their own resources, facility must service the rural community where they are located, project must have substantial community support, and environmental review must be completed/acceptable.
Maximum Award	Dollar amount not disclosed.  Direct loans and grants are available. Grants are limited to a sliding scale of total eligible project costs based on population and median household income data, starting from 75% and going down to 15%.

Program Description	Provides lifesaving equipment and prevention education tools to first responders, non-profits, and public safety organizations. All requests must fall within strict funding guidelines. Applicants must study "Grant Application FAQs' document very carefully before applying.
Eligibility	Highly competitive, early applications are encouraged. Only 600 applications per quarter are considered. Grants do not cover equipment that is already purchased, refurbished equipment, or patent-pending equipment. Favorable consideration is given to applicants within 60 miles of a Firehouse Subs restaurant (Grizzly Flats is within 60 miles of the restaurant in Folsom, CA).
Maximum Award	\$50,000 maximum; grant awards are generally between \$15,000 to \$25,000.

LIASCRIPTION	The Brothers Helping Brothers brand raises funds to provide vital tools and equipment to small and/or rural fire departments.
Eligibility	Applicant organization must serve a population of fewer than 10,000 people, or organization must have less than 30 employees. Fire department or EMS organization must operate in one of the 50 states or the District of Columbia. Majority of employees must be volunteer or paid-per-call personnel. Equipment grants as well as gently used equipment are provided; equipment may be donated instead of funding.
