Grant & Loan Opportunities

CARB Community Planning and Capacity Building Grant

Deadline: February 10, 2026

Community Planning and Capacity Building (Planning) grants provide up to \$500,000 per project to help communities plan for clean, equitable transportation solutions. These grants support early-stage planning, outreach, workforce development, and local readiness – especially for Tribal governments, rural communities, schools, and first-time applicants.

National Endowment for the Arts - NEA Grants for Arts Projects

Deadline: February 12, 2026

The NEA welcomes applications from first-time and returning applicants; from organizations serving rural, urban, and tribal communities of all sizes; and from organizations with small, medium, or large operating budgets. Applicant organizations must have completed at least five years of arts planning and must have had an operating budget of at least \$20,000. The NEA has produced several reports on the arts' benefits for health and wellbeing, including strategies for addressing the opioid crisis, engaging older adults, and social-emotional development in early childhood.

U.S Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) - VA Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program

Deadline: February 19, 2026

With total funding of \$855 million, the VA will award an estimated 200 grants to private and nonprofit organizations that provide supportive services for very low-income veterans residing in or transitioning to permanent housing. The VA considers applications from rural and tribal communities, as well as U.S. territories, a priority for grant distribution.

Sea Level Rise Adaptation Grant Program (Track 2)

Deadline: February 20, 2026

Provides funding to support nature-based sea level rise adaptation projects on the Outer Coast and in the San Francisco Bay. Eligible projects must be identified as a priority in a completed or in-progress sea level rise adaptation plan, coastal resilience plan, or other comparable land-use planning effort, with an exception for strategic relocation projects.
