[Single Family Housing Repair Loans & Grants in Presidentially Declared Disasters Pilot | Rural Development \(usda.gov\)](#)

- Due to Lack of Funding, USDA Pauses Pilot Program to Repair Homes Damaged by Presidentially Declared Disasters.
- This is effective as of June 7, USDA intends to renew the pilot if funding becomes available again.
- This pause for the pilot program will not affect applications from those who are 62 and older who remain eligible for regularly appropriated funding under USDA's Single Family Housing Repair Loans and Grants Program.
- Community Facilities Program Disaster Repair Grants
- Open until July 18, 2025, which is the conclusion of the pilot program
- Grants will be provided to eligible applicants to repair eligible essential community facilities damaged by Presidentially Declared Disasters that occurred on or after July 18, 2022



[Behavioral Health Bridge Housing \(BHBH\) Program](#)

- Application deadline June 30, 2027
- Providing over a billion dollars in funding to county behavioral health agencies and Tribal entities to operate bridge housing settings to address the immediate housing needs of people experiencing homelessness who have serious behavioral health conditions, including serious mental illness (SMI) and/or substance use disorder (SUD).

[Manufactured Housing Opportunity and Revitalization Program \(MORE\)](#)

- The MORE program helps fund a variety of activities intended to keep Mobile home Parks a safe and affordable homeownership option.
- MORE funds can be used for the acquisition, conversion to resident organization ownership, rehabilitation, reconstruction, and replacement of mobile home parks, as well the remediation of health and safety items of both parks and individual mobile homes.
