# What is an FMAG?

- The Fire Management Assistance Grant (FMAG) program provides for the mitigation, management, and control of fires that threaten such destruction as would constitute a major disaster.

# HMGP Post Fire

- FEMA is now providing mitigation assistance using HMGP funds as a result of Fire Management Assistance declarations on or after October 5, 2018. This assistance is called the HMGP Post Fire.



# Who is eligible to apply for HMGP Post Fire?

- State agencies, cities, counties, special districts, and federally recognized tribes in an area affected by the following fires:

# What types of projects are eligible for funding?

- Eligible project types include:
  - Defensible space measures
  - Ignition-resistant construction
  - Hazardous fuels reduction
  - Erosion control measures
  - Slope failure prevention measures
  - Flash flooding measures

# What much funding is available?

- There is \$6,059,290 in total project funding available.
- Subrecipients will be eligible for an additional 5 percent of the award amount for management costs.
- Project must be cost effective.
- There is a 75/25 match for project funding.

# Funding Process

Subapplicants submit Notices of Interest (NOIs) to Cal OES	6/1/2020
Cal OES reviews and denies or approves NOIs	6/30/2020
Subapplicants with approved NOIs are invited to submit a full subapplication(s) to Cal OES	7/3/2020
Subapplications due to Cal OES	9/18/2020
Cal OES reviews and selects subapplications to send to FEMA for review	3/30/2021
Projects are selected and funds are awarded	TBD
Project Implementation and Monitoring phase	33 months
Project Close Out phase	3 months
