CALIFORNIA STATE GRANT & FUNDING RESOURCES

- <u>California Preservation Foundation (CPF)</u> provides a list of State and National preservation resources and funding opportunities.
- Historic Preservation Resources Overview has information regarding historic preservation resources provided from State and Federal websites.
- Office of Historic Preservation Incentives and Grants for Historic Preservation provides current grant and incentive programs for preservation.

FEDERAL GRANT & FUNDING RESOURCES

- <u>Historic Preservation Fund (HPF)</u> manages competitive grant programs and annual formula grants to states and tribe to assist with a variety of historic preservation projects.
- National Park Service Historic Preservation Tax Incentives encourages private sector investment in the rehabilitation and re-use of historic buildings. It has leveraged \$127.12 billion in private investment to preserve more than 50,000 historic properties since 1976.
- <u>U.S. Department of the Interior Historic Preservation</u> provides a resource library on available programs, publications, trainings, and resources.
- National Trust for Historic Preservation intends to encourage preservation at the local level by supporting ongoing preservation work and providing financial assistance for preservation projects.
- <u>Preservation Directory.com</u> provides detailed information for organizations located in the U.S. and Canada dedicated to the preservation of historic structures and buildings.
- National Preservation Institute educates those involved in the management, preservation, and stewardship of cultural heritage through webinars, seminars, and other preservation-related trainings.
