
Infrastructure RSF Water Systems Resource Guide







Overview

The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), Interagency Recovery Coordination is comprised of six Recovery Support Functions (RSF) teams. The teams are Community Planning & Capacity Building (CPCB), Natural & Cultural Resources (NCR), Health & Social Services (HSS), Economic (ECON), Housing (HSG), and Infrastructure Systems (INF). The role of the RSF teams is to help communities with long-term recovery after disasters strike. This includes help to find additional funding opportunities that fall outside of Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and State Public/Individual Assistance

The Infrastructure Recovery Support Function (RSF) has developed this Water Systems Resource Guide to provide funding and technical assistance to jurisdictions impacted by drought conditions or other water related issues. These resources cover a broad range of support, the intent is for local communities to lead their recovery efforts and build capabilities. This guide's grant funding, technical assistance, and support resources are intended to assist with current recovery activities and build resiliency for the future.



After two exceptionally dry winters, California is once again experiencing drought conditions. This involves a prolonged period of abnormally low precipitation, leading to a limited amount of water in many areas. This current drought stretches across the American West.

Program Description	The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) program assists public water systems in financing the cost of drinking water infrastructure projects needed to achieve or maintain compliance with Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requirements and support to human right to water. The Division of Financial Assistant (DFA), State Water Board manages the DWSRF program and prioritizes



	financing for projects that address the most serious human health
	risks, are necessary to comply with SDWA, and assist public water systems (PWS) most in need on per household basis. Periodically
	funding programs that help provide clean and safe water are used in combination with the DWSRF program.
Eligibility	Community water systems (CWS) currently may receive principal forgiveness (PF)/grant from \$2,000,000 up to 100% of total eligible project cost depending on the project types, community served by the CWS, and residential water rates as a percentage of MHI. Financing terms varies from 0% interest to half of California's average general obligation bond rate for the previous calendar year. Repayment may be amortized for 30 to 40 years or the useful life of he financed construction facilities.

Program Description	The Infrastructure State Revolving Fund (ISRF) Program is authorized to directly provide low-cost public financing to state and local government entities, including Municipalities, Universities, Schools and Hospitals (MUSH borrowers) and to nonprofit organizations sponsored by public agencies for a wide variety of public infrastructure and economic expansion projects. Examples of ISRF financed projects include water and wastewater treatment plant upgrades or construction, venue or airport construction or street repair and upgrades.

Program Description	To help rural residents who have experienced a significant decline in quantity or quality of water, due to an emergency event (ex. drought, earthquake, hurricane, or tornado), to obtain adequate quantities of water. Events that can qualify as emergencies: drought or flood; earthquake; tornado or hurricane; disease outbreak; chemical spill, leak, or seepage; other disasters. A federal disaster declaration is not required.
Eligibility	Eligible areas include rural areas and towns with populations of 10,000 or less, tribal lands in rural area, and colonias. The area to be served must also have a median household income for non-metropolitan areas.
Maximum Award	Water transmission line grants up to \$150,000 to construct waterline extensions, repair breaks or leaks in existing water distribution lines,



	and address related maintenance necessary to replenish the water supply. Water source grants up to \$1,000,000 for the construction of new wells, reservoirs, transmission lines, treatment plants, and/or other sources of water (water source up to and including the treatment plant).

Program Description	The Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) helps farmers and ranchers to repair damage to farmlands caused by natural disasters and to help put in place methods for water conservation during severe drought. The ECP does this by giving ranchers and farmers funding and assistance to repair the damaged farmland or to install methods for water conservation.
Eligibility	Agricultural Producers, Individuals & Households
Maximum Award	The funding for ECP is determined by Congress. Up to 75% of the cost to implement emergency conservation practices can be provided; however, the final amount is determined by the committee reviewing the application.



	Qualified limited resource, underserved, and beginning farmers/ranchers may earn up to 90% cost-share. The FSA County Committee can approve applications up to \$125,000 while applications of \$125,001 to \$250,000 require state committee approval. Amounts over \$250,000 require the approval of the national FSA office.
