Grant & Loan Opportunities

[Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities \(AHSC\) Program](#)

Deadline: May 4, 2026

The AHSC Program is part of California Climate Investments, a statewide initiative that puts billions of Cap-and-Invest dollars to work reducing greenhouse gas emissions, strengthening the economy, and improving public health and the environment — particularly in Disadvantaged Communities (DACs).

[Factory Built Housing Regional Pilot Program](#)

Deadline: May 5, 2026

The Factory Built Housing Program is designed to support regional strategies that use factory-built housing to expand the supply of affordable, high-quality homes across California. The goal is to create solutions that can be scaled and replicated to move beyond one-off development projects to broader, long-term impact.

[CA Arts Council State-Local Partners Program](#)

Deadline: May 12, 2026

Provides general operating support and technical assistance for county-designated local arts agencies. The purpose of the program is to foster cultural development on the local level through a partnership between the State and the counties of California.

[CDFA State Water Efficiency and Enhancement Program \(SWEET\) Block Grants](#)

Deadline: May 15, 2026

For eligible organizations who wish to administer a community project, provide technical assistance to local farmers and ranchers within their service area, and support the implementation of on-farm SWEET projects with financial assistance.

CDFA Healthy Soils Program Block Grant

Deadline: May 15, 2026

These grants will fund organizations to provide technical assistance to producers, select on-farm projects for financial support, and to manage those projects over an implementation period of up to three years. Lead Applicants will propose a project that addresses the resource needs of their service area while aligning with the purpose of the funding.

CAL FIRE Forest Health

Deadline: June 08, 2026

Funds active restoration and reforestation activities aimed at providing more resilient and sustained forests to ensure future existence of forests in California while also mitigating climate change, protecting communities from fire risk, strengthening rural economies and improving California's water & air.

Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)

Deadline: July 23, 2026

BRIC is a Hazard Mitigation Assistance grant program that makes federal funds available to states, U.S. territories, federally recognized Tribal Nations, and local governments for hazard mitigation activities. As with all grant applications, applicants should carefully review the full NOFO to ensure proposals are responsive to all requirements such as evaluation and selection criteria.

Recognize, Respond, Connect: Supporting the Behavioral Health of Our Students

Ongoing

Location: Virtual

This free, 50-minute online training—developed by the California Department of Public Health's Office of School Health in partnership with the California Department of Education and subject matter experts—helps school staff support students' social, emotional, and physical well-being by creating safe, inclusive learning environments. The training aligns with California Education Code Section 49428.2(c) and connects participants to a broader network of professional development opportunities.

Community Planning for Disaster Recovery

July 28-29, 2026 from 2pm-6pm

Location: Virtual

This eight-hour management-level course through the National Disaster Preparedness Training Center, covers essential concepts for disaster recovery planning, including the benefits of pre-disaster planning, key elements, and the plan development process. This course will prepare participants to initiate disaster recovery plans and participate in the long-term recovery planning process in their own communities through the review of case studies and existing disaster recovery plans.
