Overview

The California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES), Interagency Recovery Coordination is comprised of six Recovery Support Functions (RSF) teams. The teams are Community Planning & Capacity Building (CPCB), Natural & Cultural Resources (NCR), Health & Social Services (HSS), Economic (ECON), Housing (HSG), and Infrastructure Systems (INF). The role of the RSF teams is to help communities with longterm recovery after disasters strike. This includes help to find additional funding opportunities that fall outside of Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and State Public/Individual Assistance.

The Natural and Cultural Resources Recovery Support Function (RSF) has developed this Oil Spill Technical Assistance Resource Guide to provide funding and technical assistance to jurisdictions impacted by drought conditions or other water related issues. These resources cover a broad range of support, the intent is for local communities to lead their recovery efforts and build capabilities. This guide's grant funding, technical assistance, and support resources are intended to assist with current recovery activities and build resiliency for the future.
