Title 2 CFR Part 200 Guidance

Title 2 of the Federal Code of Regulations (2 CFR 200) is the primary regulation governing grant funding

- These regulations apply to all FEMA Grants
 - Independent of project size or type or Subrecipient (SR)
- Reviewing a single project allows for insight into a wide range of activities
 - (procurement, contracts, policy, process, procedures)
- Monitoring provides opportunities for a deeper dive (With the SR)
 - into specific areas of Project Control and Administration
- By familiarizing the SR with the 2CFR and FEMA process tools we increase ability of the SR to avoid common contractual pitfalls
 - experienced under high stress decision processes during a disaster.



Not an Audit

Monitoring reviews funds being spent.

§ 200.329 Monitoring and reporting program performance.

Monitoring by the non-Federal entity. The non-Federal entity is responsible for oversight of the operations of the Federal award supported activities. The non-Federal entity must monitor its activities under Federal awards to assure compliance with applicable Federal requirements and performance expectations are being achieved. Monitoring by the non-Federal entity must cover each program, function or activity. See § 200.332.

Auditing reviews funds fully expended.

§ 200.501 Audit requirements.

(a) **Audit required** A non-Federal entity that expends \$750,000 or more during the non-Federal entity's fiscal year in Federal awards must have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of this part










