Cal OES Community Lifelines Fact Sheet

The Community Lifelines graphic shows how California's Emergency Support Functions (CA-ESFs) transition into recovery through Recovery Support Functions (CA-RSFs) and Recovery Support Task Forces (RSTFs). Highlighted are the connections between CA-ESFs, CA-RSFs, and critical community lifelines.

Infrastructure: Alternate Funding Research Request Form

A tool designed to help communities identify suitable infrastructure recovery programs and their eligibility criteria. By gathering essential project details such as disaster damages, scope of work, and any active or lapsed plans, this tool narrows down the focus for targeted support.

The Recovery Support Functions (RSFs) step in where other programs might fall short. The RSFs provide targeted resources and assistance to affected jurisdictions. The RSFs can also tap into additional resources that may be able to support ineligibility for Public Assistance (PA), projects denied for Hazard Mitigation (HM) funding, or cost share and layered funding assistance.

A community-driven, locally executed strategy is critical to successful disaster recovery. Every community has unique recovery priorities based on its circumstances, challenges, and resources. The RSFs support local governments by facilitating problem solving, improving access to resources, and fostering coordination among state, tribal, territorial and federal agencies, nongovernmental partners, and stakeholders.
